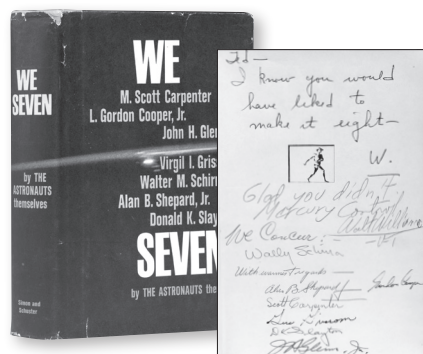

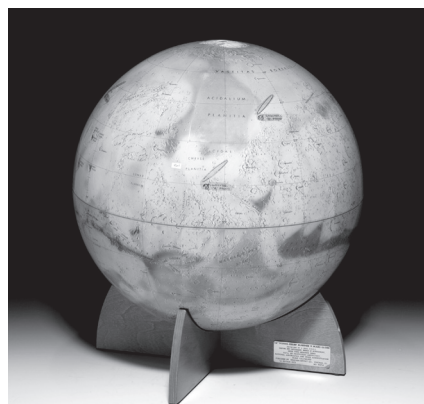

Mercury Astronauts *We Seven*
1962. Book club edition, richly illustrated with 26 photographic plates, **signed by all seven Mercury astronauts, including Scott Carpenter, John Glenn and Alan Shepard.** \$11,000.

NASA *The Many Faces of Mars: Visual-Relief Mars Globe*
1973. Striking visual-relief globe of Mars produced by NASA to incorporate the results of the photography and data collected by the Mariner 9 spacecraft. Globe measures 16 inches in diameter. \$7500.

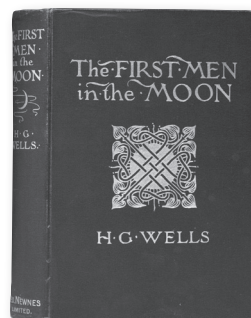


Scott Carpenter, Gordon Cooper, Wally Schirra
Document signed (Mercury Capsule blueprint)
1959. Original technical diagram of the Automatic Reaction Control system for the Project Mercury spacecraft, **inscribed by Cooper, Carpenter and Schirra.** \$1500.

Buzz Aldrin *Men from Earth*
1989. First edition of Aldrin's autobiography, **signed by him.** \$800.

The ancients were the first to dream that we might walk on the face of the Moon. Authors from Wells to Heinlein spun visions of the star-faring culture we could become. But it remained the task of scientists and engineers to build rockets that could launch us into that future. The men who blazed the trail—Shepard, Glenn, Cooper, Aldrin, Armstrong—came to represent individual courage, American ingenuity and limitless possibility.

Now, forty years later, one small step on the Sea of Tranquility remains what William Burrows called “the greatest human adventure, the *Odyssey* of the millennium.” Let Bauman Rare Books help you take a first step, small or large, toward building a collection to celebrate it.



H.G. Wells *The First Men in the Moon*
1901. “...into that silence that has no end...” First English edition of Wells' last great “scientific romance,” an inventive tale of lunar society. A beautiful copy. \$3600.

NASA *Results of the First United States Manned Orbital Space Flight*
Circa 1962. First edition of NASA's official report on the historic flight of *Friendship 7*, the first American manned orbital mission, **boldly inscribed by Apollo astronaut Walter Cunningham: “From my personal library collection. John Glenn was the first Marine in space, I was the second. Walt Cunningham, Apollo 7.”** \$1500.

Lithograph signed (Gemini Program Highlights)
No date. Color lithograph with five photographs of Gemini missions, **boldly signed by eight Gemini astronauts: Borman, Cooper, Conrad, Cernan, Gordon, Lovell, McDivitt and Schirra.** Measures 8 by 10 inches. \$950.



Edward Emerson Barnard *A Photographic Atlas of Selected Regions of the Milky Way*
1927. First edition of Barnard's monumental atlas of key regions of the Milky Way galaxy, one of only 700 copies, illustrated with 51 fine black-and-white silver photographic prints. Two quarto volumes in morocco-gilt. \$12,500.

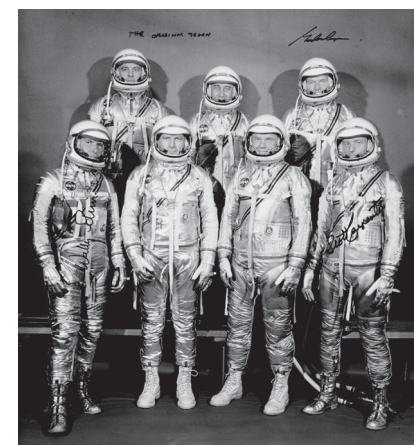
Robert A. Heinlein *Rocket Ship Galileo*
1947. First edition of Heinlein's first published science fiction novel, blending “young protagonists, gadgetry, current science and adventure.” \$2000.

Apollo Astronauts
Document inscribed (Control Panel Diagram)
1966. Vintage large diagram of the Apollo Command Module main display, **inscribed by 11 Apollo astronauts with their signatures and mission designations, including: Aldrin, Bean, Cernan, Cunningham, Gordon, Haise, Mitchell, Schirra, Stafford, Schweickart and Worden.** Measures 11 by 44 inches; housed in a custom box. \$8500.

Buzz Aldrin
Typescript signed
1969. Original Associated Press teletype coverage of the historic first manned moon landing, from the Eagle's powered descent to the lunar module's safe touchdown, 4 feet long, **boldly inscribed at a later date: “FIRST ON THE MOON, APOLLO XI, Buzz Aldrin.”** Housed in a custom box. \$4800.

Scott Carpenter, John Glenn et al.
Six Astronauts' Memoirs
1997. Signed limited editions, each volume one of 3000 copies signed by the American astronauts who forged Space Age history: ***We Seven*, signed by Scott Carpenter, Gordon Cooper and John Glenn; *Schirra's Space* signed by Walter Schirra; *Moon Shot* signed by Alan Shepard and Deke Slayton; *Men from Earth* signed by Buzz Aldrin; *Lost Moon* signed by James Lovell; and *Countdown* signed by Frank Borman.** Six volumes, handsomely bound in morocco-gilt. \$5000.

Photograph signed (Astronauts Group Portrait)
Circa 1959. Large color portrait of the original “Mercury Seven” in their silver spacesuits, **signed by three: Scott Carpenter, Gordon Cooper and Wally Schirra.** \$1500.



Committee on Aeronautical and Space Sciences *Manned Space Flight Program of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration: Projects Mercury, Gemini and Apollo*
1962. First edition, committee printing, of this report outlining America's early manned space program, **inscribed at a later date by four key astronauts: Carpenter, Cooper, Schirra and Stafford.** \$850.

Edgar Mitchell *The Way of the Explorer*
1996. First edition of the former astronaut's reflections on science and religion, **signed by Mitchell.** \$350.
