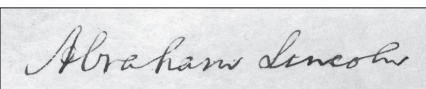




Barack Obama *The Audacity of Hope*
2006. "The ideals at the core of the American experience, and the values that bind us together despite our differences, remain alive in the hearts and minds of most Americans." First edition, first printing, **signed by President Barack Obama.** \$4500.

Thomas Jefferson *Inaugural Speech*
1801. Extremely scarce contemporary broad-side printing on silk of "one of the immortal inaugural speeches," Thomas Jefferson's first inaugural address, a ringing reaffirmation of American political and philosophical principles. Handsomely framed, entire piece measures 23 by 29 inches. \$26,000.



Abraham Lincoln *Engraved Document Signed*
March 23, 1865. Exceptionally fine Lincoln document, **boldly signed three weeks before his assassination**, appointing Samuel Breck as Lieutenant Colonel. Countersigned by Edwin M. Stanton, Secretary of War, with fragile paper seal present. Measures 17 by 14 inches. \$17,800.

Napoleon *Document Signed*
1804. Autograph document **boldly endorsed by Napoleon, with his imperial signature: "Napoleon."** Six folio sheets, measuring 11 by 17 inches. \$6500.

Rosa Parks *Quiet Strength*
1994. "God did away with all my fear." First edition, **signed by Parks.** \$1200.

Robert Kennedy *To Seek a Newer World*
1967. "These legacies, this spirit, are alive today, perhaps more than ever before." First edition of this collection of essays, **warmly inscribed by Kennedy.** \$4000.

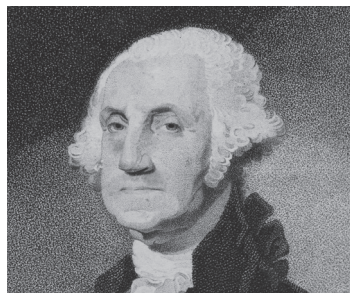

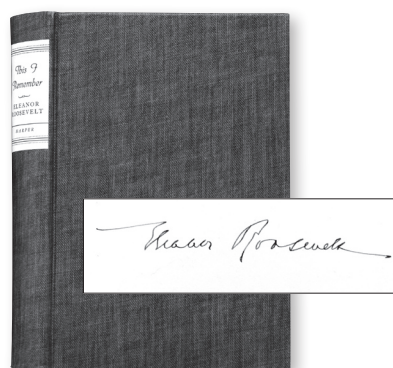
Julius Caesar *Commentaries*
1565. Rare and important first edition of Golding's landmark English translation of Caesar's *Commentaries*, one of the earliest translations of Caesar, in handsome calf binding. \$17,500.

John F. Kennedy *Profiles in Courage*
1956. First edition, early printing, of this Pulitzer-winning work, **warmly inscribed by Kennedy.** \$11,000.



John Marshall/George Washington *The Life of George Washington*
1804-07. First English editions (quarto issue) of Marshall's landmark biography of Washington, published in the same years as the American first, including ten folding maps of Washington's campaigns, extra-illustrated with portraits and additional maps. Five quarto volumes, beautifully bound in morocco-gilt. \$14,000.

John Hunt/Edmund Hillary *The Conquest of Everest*
1954. First American edition, **signed by Sir Edmund Hillary**, illustrated. \$1000.



Eleanor Roosevelt *This I Remember*
1949. Limited first edition, one of only 1000 copies **signed by the incomparable Roosevelt.** \$2800.

Martin Luther King, Jr. *Strength to Love*
1963. First edition, **boldly signed by Dr. King.** \$16,500.

Winston Churchill *World War II Speeches*
1941-46. First editions of Churchill's war speeches. Seven volumes, handsomely bound in full morocco-gilt. \$4000.

Ernest Shackleton *Heart of the Antarctic WITH: The Antarctic Book*
1909. Rare first edition, special limited large-paper issue of Shackleton's riveting account of the British expedition of 1907-1909, with the first and only edition of *The Antarctic Book*, **with the signatures of every member of the shore party, including Shackleton.** With 16 color plates, over 200 additional illustrations and folding maps. An exceptional copy, three volumes in original vellum. \$53,000.

Ulysses S. Grant *Personal Memoirs*
1885-86. First edition of the memoirs of one of the most recognized figures in American military history. Two illustrated volumes, handsomely bound in publisher's morocco-gilt. \$3000.

David Ben-Gurion *Israel: A Personal History*
1971. "The beginnings of revolutionary movements are buried unseen in the dark bosom of history." Limited first edition, **signed by Israel's founding father and first Prime Minister.** \$3500.

Malcom X/Alex Haley *The Autobiography of Malcolm X*
1965. "You can always chase a dream but it will not count if you never catch it." First edition, illustrated. \$1800.
